The Covid affected world needs your help now!

The novel coronavirus has raged all around the world. Hundreds of millions of people have fallen into poverty due to the economic recession and loss of jobs, leading to many people being on the brink of life and death. A report issued by Oxfam on July 13, 2020 warned that the food crisis will worsen, and an estimated 12,000 people may die every day due to hunger. Hunger kills more than the virus!

Since the end of January 2020, Oxfam has worked with partner groups to provide epidemic prevention support to local cleaners, low-income families, underresourced elderly, ethnic minority groups, chronically ill patients, visually impaired and intellectually disabled people. We hope to work hand in hand, heart to heart with all schools in Hong Kong to take action in order to help those in need!

Fundraising event... what is the best event to organise?

More and more schools are organising various fundraising activities. Whether it is a fundraiser sale, sports competition or a large-scale concert, a lot of manpower and resources are used to organise these events. How can these organisatonal processes be made easier? For teachers and students who lack fundraising experience, are there any tips that can help you plan an event that is both attractive and hassle less.

This is a fundraising guide for schools. I hope schools/teachers/students can know:

- 1. 10 ideas for fundraising events
- 2. 10 simple steps for event preparation

We hope you can find out from this that - it is not difficult at all to organise a fundraising event! By following the tips on this document, you will be able to do it! - Regardless of the scale of the activity, as long as you are willing, you will definitely be able to help the people around the world in need!

Big or small scale, it's up to you!

There are varying difficulties of fundraising events to organise. You can choose the most suitable event for you depending on your resources, expectations, goals, etc.



Small scale activity

- Goal: Attract 10-30 people to participate (Class)
- People needed: Not many 1-3 can do it
- Teachers: Can choose to just observe and not participate in the organisation
- Time: Short preparation time. Can be completed in one or two days
- Expenses: Very little. Within \$100
- Example: Making cards resembling hearts to raise funds

Mid-scale activity

- Goal: Attract 60-120 people to participate (Year group)
- People needed: A preparatory committee of 3-6 people
- Teachers: Understand the needs of students and assist in coordinating time and venue if the event
- Time: 1-2 weeks of preparation
- Expenses: Within \$500
- Year group Oxfam Hunger Lunch







Large scale activity

■ Goal: Attract 120-500 people's attention (Whole school)

• People needed: A preparatory committee of 5-10 people

- Time: 3-4 weeks of preparation
- Expenses: \$1000- \$5000

• Example: Whole school charity Cosplay day

Challenge level activity

- Goal: Attract 500+ people's attention
- People needed: A preparatory committee of 10+ people
- Time: One month or longer of preparation
- Expenses: Varying depending on the needs of the activity
- Example: Fundraising walkathon



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10 ideas for fundraising activities

1) Lai See for poverty

Suitable for kindergartens, primary schools and secondary schools

| Difficulty ♦ ♦ ♦ ♦ ♦ ♦ ♦ ♦ ♦ ↓ Large scale

Being one of Oxfam's annual fundraising activity, many schools have actively participated in it. Just by asking students to donate a Lai See packet, you can help people in need to receive the aid that they require. Easy to do and meaningful!



2) Film/ Animation Festival

Suitable for primary schools, secondary schools and universities

| Difficulty ★ ★ ♦ ♦ ♦ ♦ ♦ ♦ ↓ Small to large scale

Sometimes students just want to lounge and relax. Watching movies or TV shows will be popular with students. If it is well received, you could even make It a 'Movie Week' with many options of films and shows throughout the week to further increase engagement for the event. Donations will consist of the event tickets!

3) Party

Suitable for kindergartens, primary schools, secondary schools and universities

Parties are definitely the first-choice fundraising activity! Whether it is a Christmas party or a birthday party, everyone can have a good time! If you want to have a great response from the students, you must spend some time thinking about the content and the details of the party. For example, you could invite well-known alumni that students would like as guests or combine ideas #4,5 and 7. The party would be full in no time! Parties are good fundraiser events as tickets proceeds can



be donated or you could even ask participants to use donations instead of buying gifts.

4) Oxfam Hunger Lunch

Suitable for primary schools, secondary schools and universities

Although there is enough food for everyone in the world, there are still nearly 900 million people who suffer from chronic hunger. Come together to host "Oxfam Hunger Lunch" so students can directly experience the taste of hunger and donate the cost of a meal to reduce the gap to the under-resourced people. The best way to let students understand the hunger crisis is by letting them experience it themselves whether it is through the 'Light Lunch', 'Poor-Rich Lunch' or 'Skip a Lunch' event, as long as you experience it, you won't forget it!



- 5) Lunch market/ Open day Suitable for kindergartens, primary schools, secondary schools and universities

The market will make everyone curious! The preparatory committee can make popcorn as well as organise secondhand sales fairs and game stalls to attract students to buy, eat and play! The market can be arranged during lunch breaks or after school hours and can be held in conjunction with school open days or annual celebrations. Donations can either be made straight to us or you can invite us to set up a stall at the event! Everything is welcome!



6) Fun challenges

Suitable for kindergartens, primary schools, secondary schools and universities

| Difficulty $\bullet \bullet \bullet \bullet \bullet \diamond \diamond \diamond \diamond \circ$ | Small to mid-scale

Events which are both fun and challenging are the ones which students are most likely to proactively participate in. There are many options for games such as competing for the highest number of basketball shots made consecutively or building the longest domino possible. You could ask your students what event they think is the most fun! Invite your friends to donate and support you! This event can also be organised in conjunction with ideas #3 or #5.

7) Cosplay day

Suitable for kindergartens, primary schools, secondary schools and universities

| Difficulty $\diamond \diamond \bullet$ | Small to mid-scale

Been doing the same casual wear day for the past 10 years? How about trying Cosplay day? Cosplay is 'dress up' which involves using costumes, accessories, props and makeup to portray the appearance of a specific character from a movie, TV show or anime. It is a very popular activity for the younger generation nowadays (including parents too)! You can set a few fundraising goals that you would like to reach. Want to increase the fundraising amount? Invite teachers, principal and even school supervisors to dress up and have fun with everyone!

8) Real world puzzle game

Suitable for secondary schools and universities

Despite video games becoming more and more popular, many people don't want to constantly be in the virtual world but instead enjoy some traditional real-world games. Real-world games give players authentic interactions with each other and has a sense of satisfaction that cannot be mimicked by video games. For the game, participants form teams and play the roles of the story while solving the puzzle. Whether you are the game designer or the participant. It is certainly challenging but also an unforgettable experience! You can either purchase the game to play or design it yourself.





9) Formal dinner

Suitable for universities

| Difficulty + + + + + + + + + + | Large scale to challenge level

Large scale dinner events should be grand. Everyone will be well dressed and there will be a formal dinner for guests to enjoy while they enjoy performances or a speech from a celebrity. Whatever the performances may be, they must be entertaining for the guests. It takes a lot planning to prepare for a successful dinner party but if done well, the funds raised are often the highest of any event.

10) Extreme challenge

Suitable for secondary schools and universities

| Difficulty + + + + + + + + | Challenge level

Unlike the "fun challenges" in idea 6, the extreme challenge is not a joke. Participants must push their physical limits to succeed in this event. You can set up extreme challenges based on the strengths of your school or university. Examples of events would be rowing relays, marathon relays or large-scale open water swim. It is not easy for the event to succeed and the risks can also be high, but the funds raised will be representative of this if it goes well. In addition to receiving high donations, it is also an opportunity to achieve greats feats and break records to brag to your friends!
