OXFAM HONG KONG'S GLOBAL CITIZENSHIP EDUCATION PROGRAMME

Objectives:

- Develop empathy by recognising and appreciating the interdependence between different people or countries and gain the skills to identify the linkages between the world, one's nation, one's community and oneself in everyday life.
- Explore the issues of global poverty and injustice critically and proactively respond to them.
- Learn through participatory and empowering processes.

WORKSHOP DETAILS

FOOD FOR THOUGHT



Poverty in Hong Kong | Community visit

Do you know how much people living in poverty spend on food every day? This workshop will encourage participants to explore the relationship between poverty and food through a tour of a wet market.

Location: Oxfam Hong Kong's Interactive Education Centre (North Point)

Duration: 2 hours (primary school), 2.5 hours (secondary school)

Remarks: Each participant need to prepare HKD 10 for the workshop

Global inequality | Social game

Through multiple rounds of a role playing game, participants will step into the roles of farmers and executives from multinational corporations, to further explore the issue of global inequality.

Location: Oxfam Hong Kong's Interactive Education Centre (North Point)

Duration: 2.5 hours

Remarks: Suitable for middle school students or above

COMMUNITY TOUR IN SHAM SHUI PO

Poverty in Hong Kong | Community visit

Join a guided walking tour by our partner WEDO GLOBAL to learn about South Asian culture and the challenges the community faces in Sham Shui Po.

Location: Sham Shui Po

Duration: 2.5 hours (primary school and online session), 3 hours (secondary school)

FOOD RESCUE IN SHEK KIP MEI

Sustainable food | Community service

Over 1/3 of all food produced globally goes to waste. In a developed city like Hong Kong, the issue of food waste is often taken lightly while many low-income families struggle to put food on the table. In this workshop, participants will gain hands-on experience rescuing and redistributing food to the elderly in need in Shek Kip Mei, and explore the link between food waste and poverty.

Location: Shek Kip Mei

Duration: 3 hours, fixed time from 6 - 9 pm

A CLOUD ON THE HORIZON

Climate change | Interactive theatre

Participants will step into the shoes of the citizens of Beautiful Island. Because of climate change though, this island is experiencing a rise of sea level. Citizens need to decide whether they will stay or not. In this workshop, participants will explore the link between climate change and poverty through interactive theatre.

Location: Oxfam Hong Kong's Interactive Education Centre (North Point)

Duration: 2 hours (upper primary), 2.5 hours (secondary school)

This activity is co-organised with our partner DUO Production.



HUNGER BANQUET (ROCK, PAPER, SCISSORS EDITION)

Global inequality | Game

Through a Hunger Banquet with the added element of Rock, Paper, Scissors, participants will learn about inequality around the world.

Location: Your school

Duration: 1 - 2.5 hours (upper primary)

Remarks: Meals not included in the workshop fee

GAMES TO LEARN ABOUT SOUTH ASIAN CULTURE

Multiculturalism | Games

Participants will play South Asian games with WEDO Global's ambassadors and learn more about what life is like for some South Asian communities in Hong Kong.

Location: Your school or Oxfam Hong Kong's Interactive Education Centre (North Point)

Duration: 2.5 - 3 hours

SOUTH ASIAN PICTURE BOOKS

Multiculturalism | Picture books



Participants will get read tales from South Asia with WEDO Global's ambassadors and learn more about what life is like for some South Asian communities in Hong Kong.

Location: Oxfam Hong Kong's Interactive Education Centre (North Point) or online

Duration: 1 - 1.5 hours

- . All activities are subsidized by Oxfam Hong Kong, please note that the number of participants must meet the minimum requirement, otherwise, there will be an extra charge of HK\$1,500 per activity.
- . Exceptions may be made for participants who cannot afford the fee.

PROCEDURE

- . Fill in the online form: <http://bit.ly/enrollmentohk>
- . We will confirm your registration status within 10 working days though email. If we cannot confirm your application, we may provide alternative options.
- . Reply the confirmation email within 3 working days to confirm your application.
- . Settle the payment within 4 weeks once you have received our invoice.

MAKING CHANGES

Incident weather /EDB announce school closures:

- . Postpone to another date in the same school year
- . Switch to an online activity. The fee will be based on the selected event.
- . If the above options are not applicable, we will cancel the activity. Please note, we will deduct HK\$1,000 from the refund to compensate our facilitator(s). We will then return the rest of the payment.

Personal reasons:

- . HK\$200: Change of event time and number of participants
- . Request that is made 14 working days before the activity date
 - HK\$300: Postpone to another time in the same school year or switch to online version
 - HK\$500: Cancel activity
- . Request that is made 2 - 13 working days before the activity date
 - HK\$500: Postpone to another date in the same school year or switch to online version
 - HK\$2000: Switch to another activity or cancel activity
- . No refund or changes will be made for requests that are made in less than 2 working days.

POLICIES

COVID-19 ARRANGEMENT

For the health, safety and well-being of our participants, staff and community, we have strict safety protocols implemented at the Oxfam Interactive Education Centre:

- . Temperature checks upon arrival for all participants
- . Regular cleaning and sterilisation throughout the day
- . Mandatory wearing of masks

ONLINE ARRANGEMENTS

- . Our online activities will primarily be held on Zoom.
- . We may make changes based on the applicants' requests, however this will be made on a case by case basis.
- . The applicant or person in charge has to help out on e-classroom management and be present in the waiting room 15 mins before the event.
- . No recording or filming may be made without prior consent from Oxfam Hong Kong.

SAFEGUARDING

- . All staff are bonded by the Oxfam's Code of Conduct.
- . Staff or facilitators whose jobs involve direct contact with children undergo a Sexual Conviction Record Check (SCRC).

FEE WAIVER

Exemptions can be made for those who cannot afford the fee and fit any one of the following criteria:

- . Comprehensive Social Security Assistance (CSSA) Scheme recipient
- . Financial Assistance Schemes for Primary & Secondary Students recipient
